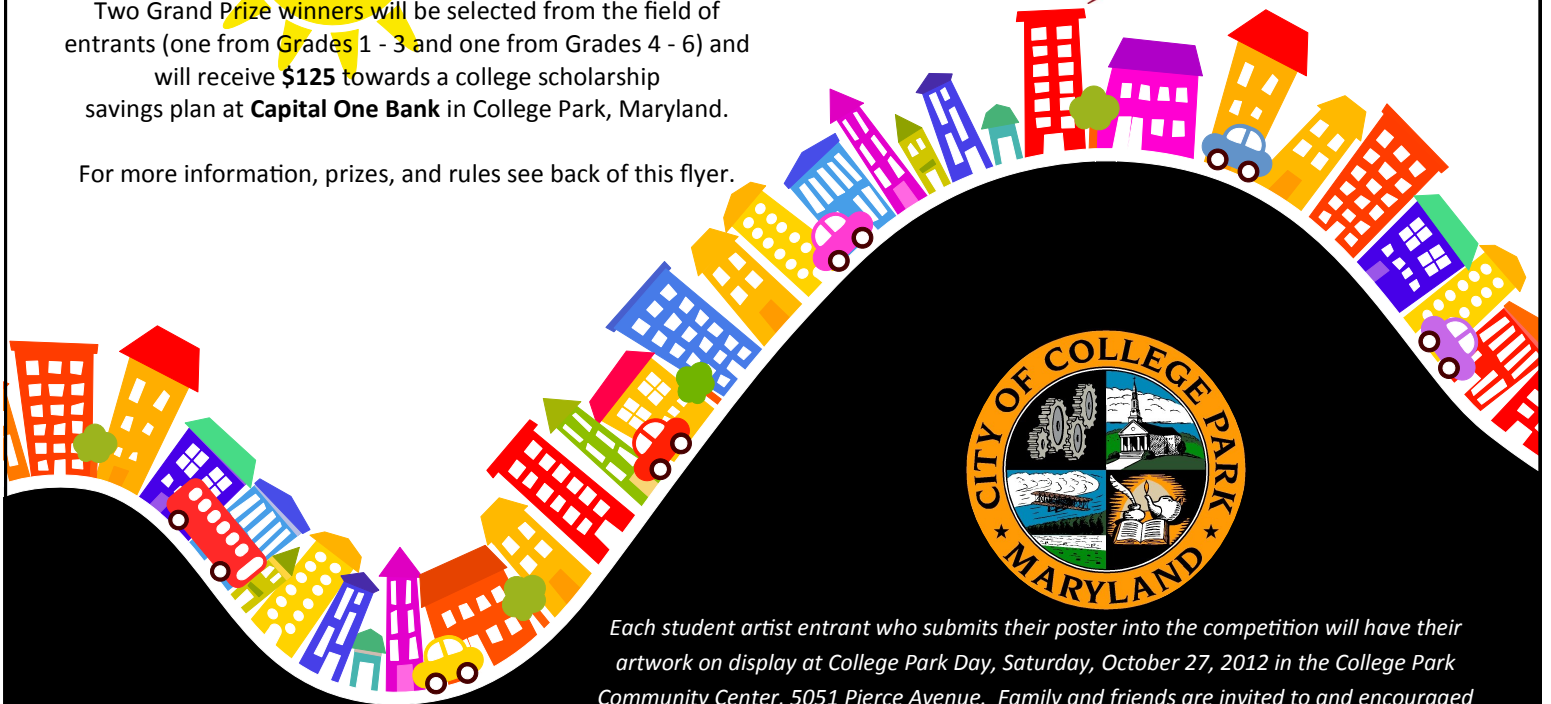

Each student artist entrant who submits their poster into the competition will have their artwork on display at College Park Day, Saturday, October 27, 2012 in the College Park Community Center, 5051 Pierce Avenue. Family and friends are invited to and encouraged to attend the event and view their student's artwork.

The deadline for submission/entry into the College Park Day Poster Contest is *Friday, October 5, 2012.*

The City of College Park, as part of its celebration of the College Park community on the third annual College Park Day, October 27, 2012, is again hosting a poster contest for local schoolchildren.

For the first time **Capital One Bank** is sponsoring the poster contest and will be awarding a grand prize of \$125.00 towards a college scholarship account at their financial institution to the overall winner (in each age classification category, *Grades 1 - 3, Grades 4 - 6*)

The title of the contest "**The Unique Diversity of Our Community**" asks College Park's children to use any medium including but not limited to: pencil, crayon, paint, or pictures to show what they think the unique diversity of College Park Community means to them. Each poster must be no larger than 11" x 17".

How to enter:

Take your artwork (no larger than 11" x 17") to your school's main office by Friday, October 5, 2012.

The back of your artwork must contain the following information:

Your Name / Your Parent or Guardian's Name / Your Grade & School / Your home address / Your telephone number

For children who live in the City of College Park and go to schools outside of the city or who are home schooled, please drop off your artwork to the City Clerk's Office/windows at 4500 Knox Road, College Park, MD 20740. Monday - Friday 8:30am - 9:30pm; Saturdays 1:00pm - 9:30pm; closed Sunday's and holidays.

The deadline for submission/entry into the College Park Day Poster Contest is **Friday, October 5, 2012.**

****Entrants must live in the City of College Park to be eligible for consideration of prizes.****

Prizes

Prizes will be awarded in two classification categories: *Grades 1 - 3 & Grades 4 - 6*

Winning student artists will be selected by officials from their school where their entries are submitted. Students going to school outside of the City of College Park or home schooled students ("city applicants") will be selected by a special panel of officials.

Each school, plus the panel of special city officials will select one winning student artist from each grade classification that will receive the following prizes: Automatic entry to the grand prize finalist competition with their artwork prominently displayed at College Park Day, Saturday, October 27, 2012 from 11:00am - 3:00pm; Certificate presented to each winning artist at the event, on stage by the Mayor of College Park at 2:15pm as the winner of their school/city and grade classification category; College Park Day limited edition t-shirt.

Grand Prize

Each finalist will have their artwork prominently displayed at College Park Day, Saturday, October 27, 2012 11:00am - 3:00pm. A committee of distinguished and special guests will judge the finalist poster contest competition during the event.

One grand prize winner from each grade classification category will be selected from the field of finalists (one from *Grades 1 - 3*, and one from *Grades 4 - 6*) and will receive \$125 towards a college scholarship into a State 529 plan or Coverdell Education Savings Plan at **Capital One Bank** in College Park. The grand prize winner's parents/guardians will be contacted by the sponsor/ bank following the event to make an appointment to come to their local branch at 7406 Baltimore Avenue, College Park, Maryland 20740 and open an account/add the grand prize scholarship money into an existing account for the grand prize winning student.
